This Ceremony of Admission may be used by the Incumbent/Priest-in-Charge* and the new member's Church in times when in is not possible for a local Branch Chaplain or the National Chaplain to be in attendance.

The Incumbent/Priest-in-Charge, having sought permission from the National Guild Chaplain, should be presented with the Candidate by an appropriate person of the Congregation — for instance a Church Warden.

This Ceremony of Admission should take place during the main worship of the Parish on a Sunday and may be inserted just before the Peace at a Eucharist Service or other appropriate place

This order may be produced for all members of the Congregation.

- advising, upon request, and making recommendations as to terms of employment and welfare of any Member;
- recording the gamut of work undertaken by Vergers; in addition noting each Member's training, experience and qualifications.
